	Third Party Liability Insurance	
	It is the responsibility of the student to take out insurance (from home) for personal belongings, accidents and third party liability while studying in Germany. TU Berlin does not cover any losses that may occur.	
Additional fees to pay	If staying in a dormitory, students are required to pay a deposit of one and half months' rent.	
Student jobs available/allowed	It is difficult to find a student job in Berlin. Foreign students cannot base their finances on a student job.
